Message to the Commissioner Postcard Project Instructions for Teachers



Distribute

Distribute the postcards to students at your school aged 8-12 years and ask them to answer the six questions it contains. There is also an option to add an illustration.

Privacy

Please let your students know that their responses are anonymous and that they do not need to share their answers. To encourage a diversity of original responses, please ask your students to keep their responses private and suggest that they keep their completed postcards facedown until you collect them.

Return your postcards to the CCYP

Return the cards to the Commissioner by using the self-addressed envelope provided in your school's project pack. Completed postcards need to be returned by Friday 13 December (end of Term 4) via the Department for Education courier system.

Accessibility

Any student aged 8-12 years in your class who would like to take part, but who is unable to write their answers themselves, can ask you to assist. If this is the case, we ask that you please mark the card 'ADULT ASSISTED' and the reason for this extra support, so that we can allow for this differentiation in the statistical analysis.
