

Getting better

- Infant mortality **3.1 per 1000 in 2016 and 2.5 per 1000 in 2020**
- Infants fully immunised at 2 years **90.2 per cent in 2017 and 93.0 per cent in 2021**
- Children who have never smoked tobacco **13.8 per cent in 2014 and 10.2 per cent in 2017**
- Preventable hospitalisations **14.8 per cent in 2017 and 10.8 per cent in 2021**
- Drivers caught annually not restraining kids **761 cases in 2017 and 327 cases in 2021**
- Arrests with young people involved **81.2 per 10,000 in 2019 and 64.4 per 10,000 in 2021**
- Eligible young people enrolled to vote **61.6 per cent in 2021 and 73.6 per cent 2022**

Getting worse

- Disabled kids who are engaged in school, training or work **84.8 per cent in 2016 and 81.5 per cent in 2021**
- Year seven students at age-level literacy **95.2 per cent in 2016 and 92.6 per cent in 2021**
- Students developmentally challenged when they enter school **23.5 per cent in 2015 and 23.8 per cent in 2021**
- Optimistic about life **85.7 per cent in 2019 and 82.4 per cent in 2022**
- Are connected to adults in their school **61.4 per cent in 2019 and 59.4 per cent in 2022**
- Victims of crime **47.7 per 10,000 in 2019 and 55.9 per 10,000 in 2021**
- Children in out-of-home care **10.3 per 1000 in 2017 and 11.8 per 1000 in 2021**
